Library

We have over 170,000 print and digital titles to support your study.



We provide more than 170,000 print titles in our library and digital titles you can access online from anywhere. These include e-books and journals through our subscriptions and databases to support your research.

You can access expert support services to help you make the most of the resources and library staff can assist you through online help guides, group workshops, or one-to-one sessions.

We have a responsive student request scheme to bring new books and journals in, and you can also access collections at other universities using the SCONUL Access Scheme. Our interlibrary loans service provides access to materials beyond our holdings.

Located in the middle of campus, the library has a variety of working spaces to suit your study needs, from individual silent study areas for focusing on your work, to rooms for group work and 24/7 social learning spaces. There is also a 24/7 computer room just next door to help fit study around your other commitments.





Accommodation

Many postgraduate students apply to live on campus in one of the 38 houses in our Student Village.

We understand that postgraduate students often go on placement so we can offer a 42-week contract (the duration of your course) with a break clause. So, if you do find that your placement is more than 30 minutes or 30 miles away, you can break your tenancy for this period without paying any fees.



Benefits of living on campus include:




Sport, Health, & Wellbeing

Levels of postgraduate study

Taught postgraduate degrees are built up with credits. Some programmes allow you to exit once you reach a certain level.

Teaching is typically through a blend of learning including small seminars and tutorials, online learning, hands-on practical research, placements, as well as a significant element of independent study to develop your research skills to a high standard.

Duration of study

Our programmes can offer flexible learning, study, and research. With a combination of teaching in seminars and lectures, practical experience and placements, and campus or distance learning, you can study alongside other commitments. Many of our courses offer part time options.

Master of Research (MRes)

The MRes degree is a research-focused Master's programme that offers an excellent platform for professional growth and can prepare students for PhD study. This programme provides a framework for learning and conducting research in your area of interest whilst receiving the necessary support and guidance from staff.

An MRes will allow you to explore research methods, undertake an independent project related to your specialist area of interest, and develop a Master's project with the help of academic tutorials. You will have the opportunity to collaborate with research-active academic staff and other students, which to date has led to several research publications.

The MRes programme is suitable for individuals from diverse backgrounds who wish to gain a critical understanding of recent developments in their chosen field. It also equips students with the analytical and research skills necessary to undertake advanced research projects.





The MRes is flexible enough to cater to experienced professionals seeking senior roles and those with less experience looking to establish a career path after their undergraduate studies.





Where you learn	You will be based in one school, with a minimum six-week placement in a second school to provide breadth. You will have around 18 days on campus over the academic year.	You will have two blocks of 5-week learning at the University, and the rest of the time in two block placements in two schools, contrasting in key stage, context, and location. This broadens your experience and elevates your employability and mobility.
Type of learning	You will learn in school from experienced teachers and at university from lecturers, with a mixture of classroom observation, teaching, and subject development. Your responsibility will steadily increase throughout the year, but your learning will still be connected to policy and research.	Learning will combine practice, research, theory, and policy in schools and the University. With your steady increase in responsibility, you will gain confidence and competence. Setting personalised targets will help you progress to become the best teacher you can be, at your own pace.
Your closest colleagues	You will work alongside staff in your school, and they will become your close support network. You will be part of a cohort of trainees and will have a designated mentor and tutor. You are made to feel like a member of the school staff and trainee professional. You would apply via the Department of Education. You are assessed at an interview by the University and teachers from the PGCE network.

Loans are available from Student Finance England
(SFE), for students in England who are starting an eligible postgraduate Master's programme in 2023.
This is a non-means-tested loan of up to £11,836*.
There are across Northern Ireland, Scotland, and Wales.

How it works

The loan is paid directly to the student. You can choose how you use it to pay for your programme fees and living costs.

Loans are spread across the length of the programme and paid in instalments. You can find details of this online.

Repayments will be calculated at 6% of any income over £21,000*. Repayments will start the April following the completion of your programme, subject to meeting the annual income threshold.

Criteria

The loans are only available if you have not already completed a Master's qualification or a higher level qualification like a PhD. There are various eligibility criteria for the loan from SFE, including:

- You must be a UK or EU national or have settled status.
- You must normally live in England (i.e. not have moved here for the purpose of postgraduate study) and have been living in the UK for at least three years before you start your programme.
- You will have to be aged under 60 before the first day of the first academic year of your programme.

Teacher Training

Students studying PGCE and School Direct (unsalaried) can receive funding from SFE and can apply for the same type of funding as undergraduate students – Tuition Fee Loan, Maintenance Loan (standard amount and higher income assessed amount) and any relevant grants.

PGCE and School Direct students may also be eligible for a teacher training scholarship or bursary dependant on entry grades and subject. For further details see getintoteaching.education.gov.uk

Terms

& Conditions

A contract is formed between you and the University of St Mark & St John as soon as you accept the offer of a place on a programme of study offered by the University. The terms of this contract are set out below and your acceptance of a place and enrolment as a student of the University are expressly subject to them.

- You should note that an offer of a place on a programme made by the University may be expressed to be subject to a number of conditions as specified below.
- 2. The University does not accept responsibility or liability for loss or damage to property, or transfer of computer viruses to equipment used, or any other loss, damage or liability or claim suffered in connection with an application made by an individual for admission to the University.
- 3. The University's annual Prospectus is produced at the earliest possible date. normally by February in the year prior to the year of entry to which the Prospectus relates, to provide the maximum assistance to prospective applicants. Changes may occur to programmes and information described in the Prospectus between the date of printing and the beginning of the relevant academic year, for example, because of government policy etc. Any changes will be immediately communicated to students.
- **4.** All offers of places made by the University are made on the basis that the University expects to provide the

- programme in the intended vear of enrolment. In the unlikely event that it proves necessary to cancel a student's choice of programme, or materially alter the nature or content of a student's choice of programme, the University will endeavour to offer the student a place on a similar programme, if possible. However, the University cannot accept liability for any loss, distress or inconvenience caused by the cancellation or alteration of a student's chosen programme prior to enrolment.
- 5. All offers and subsequent contracts will only be valid against evidence of the prescribed entry qualifications being obtained by the potential student before their registration on a programme. The University unreservedly declares null and void any offer, invitation to treat, or contract where this obligation is not met.
- 6. A condition of enrolment is that all students are required to abide by the University's Regulations, and the regulations governing their academic programme. For example, these include rules about academic assessment and progression, student

- appeals against academic failure, the University's rules for good conduct and student discipline, Library and IT regulations, health and safety rules etc. The contents are incorporated in these terms and conditions by reference. A student should be aware that he/she may be excluded from the University under these Regulations. Copies of the Regulations will be available for inspection at enrolment and on the University's website and Virtual Learning Environment 'Learning Space'.

If asked by the police, or any other regulatory or government authority investigating illegal activities, we may need to provide your personal details. Information supplied by a

- student at enquiry, enrolment and otherwise supplied by a student to the University will be used by the University's central administrative offices. its library, and its facilities for administrative purposes only, in accordance with the University's registration under the Data Protection Act. Some information held about you will be sent to the **Higher Education Statistics** Agency (HESA). This forms vour HESA record, which contains details of your ethnic group and any disabilities you have. HESA will pass your record, or parts of it, to the relevant organisations that need it to carry out their statutory functions connected with funding higher education. These include:

HESA and the organisations listed above will use the information mainly to produce statistics. This may result in information being published and released to other approved users, including academic researchers and commercial organisations. Your record will not be used in a way that could affect you personally and the organisations will take precautions to reduce the risk of you being identified from the information once it is published and released.

While you are a student, we will need to keep your contact details. These do not form part of your HESA record, so HESA and the organisations listed above cannot use this record to contact you.

Towards the end of your studies, we will pass your contact details to the organisation that has been contracted to carry out the National Student Survey. That organisation will use your details only for that purpose, and will then delete them.

15 months after you graduate, we will contact you to ask you to fill in the HESA 'Graduate Outcomes' survey. We will not give your contact details to HESA. You might be included in a sample of leavers who are surveyed again a few years after they graduate. If so, we will pass your contact details to the organisation that has been contracted to carry out that survey. That organisation will use your details only for that purpose, and will then delete them. (If you do not want to take part in this second survey, please let us know).
